Dear Parents/Carers,

Excellent communication between home and school is essential to your child's success. Please communicate directly with your child's teacher as a starting point for communications unless urgent. Phone, email or a note are all appropriate ways of contacting teachers. Please keep the communication open and feel free to discuss your child's progress. A reminder that if choosing to communicate using email, be clear and concise in your communication, please don't expect teachers to respond during the day as they are busy teaching, doing duty and attending meetings. Be patient in waiting for a response; a time frame of 24 hours is acceptable, however do not expect our staff to respond after 5:30pm or on weekends as this is their family time.

The school, as a whole, has a number of ways of communicating information to you – **newsletter, Facebook, SMS, Skoolbag, Website (for the newsletters), email, and Parent Lounge**. This plethora of communication avenues leads me to question the need for the various year level parent Facebook pages that currently exist. As they do exist, I must clarify my concerns regarding them.

- Firstly, *no* parent page is to have the name or logo of the school attached to it without permission being granted to do so.
- Secondly, please do not use this form of communication as a forum for airing your concerns about the school, teachers or other students. You will inevitably have others 'weigh in' with their opinions and often the truth of the matter is lost in a sea of complaints and misconceptions.

We are very open and accommodating and will always listen when you have a concern, so I ask you please, if you need further information or clarification on any matter, do not hesitate to call, email or make an appointment.

BEFORE SCHOOL ROUTINE

This is a reminder to all parents that if your child is at school before 8:15am, they must be sitting in the undercover area and not walking or running around, regardless of whether you are with them or not. Duty in the morning begins at 8:15am; therefore, the children are not supervised until then. Please help us keep everyone safe by reminding your child, whether you are present or not, that they must be sitting down in the UCA until the 8:15 bells goes. Alternatively, you may utilise the Before School Care service that is available to parents at a cost.

Our P&F AGM followed by our first P & F meeting for the year will be held on Thursday, 13 February at 6:00pm in the staffroom. Please come along and join us if you are able.

CAR NAME PLATES

Just a reminder to all parents that we would really appreciate you using your family name plate as you drive through the Pick Up Zone of an afternoon. These are available to you from the office if you have misplaced the one provided. It is much easier for the teachers on duty to identify your car and speed up the process of calling children. As you enter the Pick Up Zone, you need to display the name plate either on the passenger side of the dashboard, the passenger window or on the passenger visor (attached with rubber bands and visor down). This allows us to read your family name as the vehicles drive through. We thank you for your support and assistance in helping us ensure that our pick-up zone is safe for everyone. If you require a name plate, please let Heather in the office know.

Students in Year 4 (or older) who have participated in the Reconciliation program are invited to join our sacraments program to prepare for Confirmation/Eucharist.

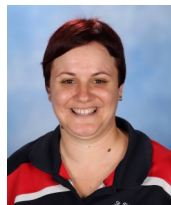

HANDY HOMEWORK TIPS

SIGHT WORDS AND SPELLING WORDS:

In order to be a successful reader in the early years of Primary School, children need to have a good recollection of high frequency sight words. Children need to learn these words by sight as it is very difficult to use sound knowledge to work out these words. It is important that children engage in meaningful learning experiences in order to gain the knowledge and understanding about a subject matter. Have fun with your child as they begin to learn to read the high frequency words. Always try to point out these words in our environment to make connections for your child.

HOME READING:

- Establish a home reading routine. Read aloud with your children every day. Talk about the illustrations and contribute where you can. Share your excitement for reading and this will be the model your child will adopt.
- During home reading time, turn off electronic devices.
- **Discuss your child's school reading goal with them. These goals should be getting sent home in the upcoming weeks. Assist your child with working on their goal and developing confidence.**
- Before you read a book, set your child up for success. Reading is not a test! Reading time is only short so do some of the following: Keep the introduction short – one minute is enough. Talk about the illustrations and the title. Read the blurb and talk about the author, talk about any unusual words, read a page here and there as your child flicks through the book, discuss the characters.
- If reading time is stressful, move the reading to a new location. Instead of sitting at the kitchen bench, move to the lounge room floor, or go outside and sit under a tree.
- Find a reading time that works for your family. It is better to have an enjoyable time than a laborious 30 minutes where everyone is left feeling frustrated.
- At the end of the reading time, ask questions that encourage discussion, for example: What was your favourite part? Tell me about the characters. What do you think will happen next? What did you think about that setting? What do like/ dislike about this book? There is no need to interrogate the reader. Make it a conversation as you would in a book club.
- Encourage your child to read independently. A bedside light is one of the best enticements for your child to read before going to sleep.
- The less you interrupt your child whilst they are reading, the more you are supporting the readers independence, resilience and confidence. Zip your lips, monitor the miscues (errors), and listen as your child reads.
- Avoid judging your child's reading with words such as: 'good', 'excellent' or 'getting better'. Instead say things about the strategies your child uses when reading such as: 'I like how you read on when you came to that difficult word.' 'I like how you changed your voice to be the voice of the character in the story'. 'I noticed that you reread the bit that did not make sense.'
- If your child is reading independently and has reached the level of chapter books, it is not necessary for you to read aloud together every day of the week. That is not to say, you cannot continue to share reading time.
- Independent readers pick and choose what they read. They are entitled to read some and reject others. They are entitled to not complete books because they are boring. Readers make choices.
- Model what it means to be an enthusiastic reader. Create a home of readers where everyone reads. Talk about what you have read. Read aloud what makes you laugh and share it with your child.

HEALTH NOTICE: SCHOOL SORES

As there have been some cases of school sores (impetigo) in our school recently, we need to make all parents aware of the correct procedures. The information below comes from the Queensland Health website.

School sores (impetigo) is an infection of the skin and called “school sores” because school age children are usually the most likely to be infected and sores can be spread throughout a school.

- Impetigo is caused by bacteria that are able to live in the nose, throat, on the skin or in other parts of the body.
- These sores can be anywhere on the body, but often appear on the face near the mouth and nose and/or on the arms and legs.
- Impetigo is easily spread.
- It is more common in hotter months.

What does it look like?

- Impetigo usually starts with a blister or a group of blisters
- The blister bursts leaving a patch of red, wet skin, which weeps.
- The spot becomes coated with a tan or yellowish crust.
- The spots can be itchy.

What to do?

- Please see a doctor to check the condition. Antibiotics are usually required to clear up the infection.
- Keep area clean with regular washing.
- Clothing, sheets and towels need careful washing.

Impetigo is contagious. Children need to remain at home until antibiotic treatment has commenced for 24 hours and sores must be covered with a watertight dressing.

Please advise our school office, if your child has been infected.

We are encouraging our students to be vigilant with hand washing.

Thank you for assisting us in all health matters.

PROTOCOLS FOR THE SAFE ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION AT OUR SCHOOL

Step 1 - We require a - Written Parental Request.

Our school requires a written request from parents if their child is to be issued with any medication at school. For short term periods a letter is sufficient. For long term medications a medication request form must be filled in. (These forms are available with Mrs Hicks in the office)

Step 2 - Medical Authorisation is Required

We require medical authorisation from a prescribing health practitioner to administer any medication to students (including over-the-counter medications such as paracetamol or alternative medicines).

An original pharmacy label with the appropriate information on it will suffice as medical authority.

Ensure medication is provided in the original container with an attached prescription pharmacy label which constitutes a medical authority, and includes:

- student name
- dose
- time the medication is to be taken
- any other relevant directions for use e.g. whether medication is to be taken with food.

Step 3 – Safe Administration Protocols are followed by Mrs Hicks and Mrs Hyde when administering medication.

1. Infection control procedures to be followed – wash hands, gloves.
2. Check the student's identity – ask the students name.
3. Confirm the name on the label and confirm correct medication / dosage etc.

Step 3 – Record of Administration

All medication administered to students must be recorded. Our school has an administration of medication record sheet to record the details on. This sheet is taken to offsite activities such as camps or excursions, if medication is to be administered.

It is essential that before medication is issued to a student, the student informs Mrs Hicks or Mrs Hyde of his/her name and the name is confirmed on the medication package and the record sheet. We ask parents to take any medication to be administered to students, to the office. **Classroom teachers do not administer any medication. No medication will be administered without the written consent of a parent/carer.**

KOALA ADOPTION

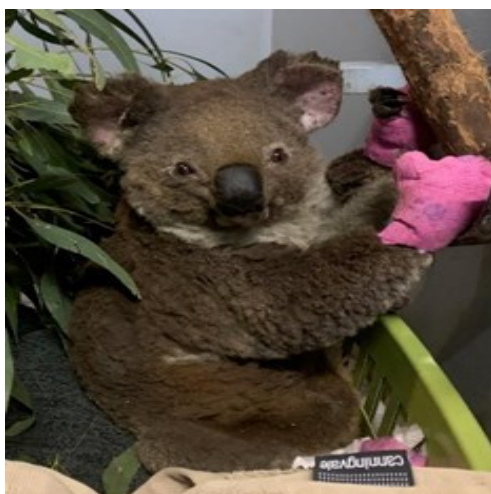
They're cuddly, they're cute, they're the two newest members of our St Francis Xavier family. We are excited to announce that our school has decided to adopt two adorable koalas named Anwen and Paul. Anwen and Paul are burns victims from the recent tragic bushfires in NSW. These two koalas were the first to be rescued from the fire grounds at Lake Innes Nature Reserve near Port Macquarie.

Anwen is a gentle young female koala who suffered singeing to 90% of her body and radiant burns to her hindquarters. Anwen also has burns to the pads on her hands and feet. She has accepted the 5 star service at the Port Macquarie Koala Hospital really well and loves the daily delivery of fresh leaf. Anwen has also found a perfect spot to sit in the unit, so that she can prop her very sore hands on and this has become "Anwen's spot".

Paul is a young male koala and was the first live koala to be found at the Crestwood/Lake Innes Nature Reserve fire ground. He was found curled up on the burnt ground by a member of the public who brought him to the Koala Hospital. Paul was severely dehydrated and had suffered burns to his hands and feet which usually occurs when the koala climbs down the burning trunk of the tree. His fur is also singed over 90% of his body.

By adopting Anwen and Paul, as a school, we can help fund their ongoing medical care and food costs, both which are vital to their recovery. Stay tuned for updates on their wellbeing and upcoming fundraisers for our eucalyptus loving, native Australian animal.

This is a term-time contract position (30HPW) for 2020, with the possibility of further extension. A commencement date will be negotiated.

The successful applicant will work across multiple schools in the Mackay region and support each school's individual approaches to all aspects of Indigenous Education.

The successful applicant should be able to demonstrate:

- A knowledge and understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories, cultures and spiritualities.
- An ability to communicate sensitively and effectively with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, their families and school staff to improve educational outcomes through targeted and direct academic, cultural and pastoral support.

When applying please ensure you include a 1-2 page cover letter statement outlining your demonstrated capabilities as outlined in the above criteria.

DRAMA ENROLMENTS 2020

Do your children need Drama? Drama enables them to develop communication skills and practice their social skills as well. The children are taught the basic skills and develop them throughout the year and in third term; students prepare items for performance either at the eisteddfod or for presentation to parents. For older students, who have been learning Speech & Drama for a number of years, I also offer preparation for Trinity College Examinations (an internationally recognised qualification). The exam lessons are held on Saturday in the hall. Lesson fees for 2020 will be \$10/group lesson. Individual lessons will cost \$15/30min or \$30/hour.

My students have performed very well at eisteddfods each year competing in poetry, characterisation, mime, duologues, prepared reading, period drama, Shakespearean, and storytelling. Another example of the high standard at my small studio, since 2010, seven of my students have achieved the Barbara Sisley Award for highest marks in the state in Trinity College Exams. This takes a lot of time and attention to detail.

I am starting classes for this week. Of course, my current students have first priority but if you wish to learn Drama I have a few spaces so please collect and complete an enrolment form from the school office.
